We are thrilled to introduce you to Suzette March who joined the Guernsey Caring for Ex-Offenders staff team as Activities Key-worker in August 2024. Suzette has been a volunteer mentor with the charity since it started back in 2013.

She is married with two adult children, two adult step-children and 10 grandchildren.

Prior to joining GCFEO, Suzette worked for 26 years with Health and Social Care, based at the Kindred Family Hub. In this role she worked with many island families helping to facilitate good parenting skills through various courses such as Incredible Years (2-13 years) and more latterly a Caring Dads course.

Suzette has also worked with Health and Social Care as part of the Occupational Therapy team.

Interests outside of work include being a keen cliff walker and swimmer. Much of her free time is spent supporting and looking after her family.



Faith is an important part of Suzette's life and she is a member of Holy Trinity Church. She strongly believes that making time to listen to God is key and that it was God who opened the doors and made a way for her to come and work with GCFEO.

Caves - Michelle Stringer / Activities Manager

Our workshops at the Caves are overseen by our GCFEO Activities Manager, Michelle Stringer and our GCFEO Activities Key-worker, Suzette March. During 2024, we had 35 people who attended sessions, which is an increase on the previous year.

We continued to provide a variety of activities for 3 days each week. Creative activities included craft, gardening, woodwork, art and sewing. Social activities included games sessions, drop in chat opportunities and our Wednesday lunches were always a real hit. During the Autumn months everyone was busy creating tile mosaic pictures, which look great and will be for sale this year.

We took residency in the OSA Pop Up Shop in Smith Street for a week in June and were, once again, able to sell our handmade items to raise funds. We will be trying other opportunities this year.

As well as the activity sessions; which are valuable for social interaction, building confidence and helping to form routines, we continue to provide a resource for the prison and probation services.

We helped several people with either day release from prison on temporary licence or community service orders and supervised adult family contact.









Employment - Andrew Kewell / Deputy Co-ordinator

During 2024, we were fortunate to secure employment for 18 service users. This followed 181 detailed applications and enquiries. Throughout the year we also provided in-work support to a further 15 service users to help them maintain their employment.

We are always looking for new employers who would be prepared to work with us in providing job opportunities. This can vary between States of Guernsey Kickstart and Work to Benefit schemes to paid positions from the get go.

We are very grateful for the ongoing support of the Guernsey Job Centre as we work together to secure employment for ex-offenders.



Funding

In order to continue providing this service, secure funding is absolutely crucial. Not only does this provide for the charity's immediate needs but offers us the opportunity to forward plan with confidence, allowing us to develop in a way that provides the best for the needs of those we serve, and thereby their families and the community as a whole. A big thank you to all our donors and grant funders.

December 2024 saw the end of our current 3 year year funding arrangement with Employment and Social Security and following a successful application, we are delighted to announce this has been renewed for a further 3 years, starting from January 2025.



Ex-Offenders' ('GCFEO') vision is to reduce re-of-fending by reintegrating ex-offenders (of any faith or none) into society through the local church.

Working in partnership with other agencies, GCFEO seeks to support ex-offenders to live changed lives. We believe that by breaking the cycle of crime, individuals, families and neighbourhoods can be transformed.
